



Student Four-Day School Week Survey Results



Academics: Comments involving homework, study time, increased class periods, etc.

Appointments: Ability to schedule appointments on the fifth day

Attendance: Increased attendance

Consistent Schedule:

Inclement Weather: Snow days could be made up on the fifth day.

Longer Weekend: Many comments just wrote "longer weekend" and were counted as such, not as "More family time"

Monetary Savings: Savings on transportation, food, and utilities


More Family Time: Additional time on the fifth day to spend time together, or ability to travel over 3 days

Recruit and Retain staff: Curriculum planning, morale, teacher benefits

Student Benefits: This category included anything non-academic relating to students and the four day week. These comments included the ability to get more rest, less stress, make school more manageable and enjoyable, allowing them to be kids longer, better mental health, and the ability to participate in other activities outside of school.

Student Employment: Students could use the fifth day to work.

Length of school year: Concern over extending the school year into June

Shortened Breaks: Less time to spend with family over the breaks

Childcare: Concern over parents needing to find someone to watch young children

Academics: Concern over additional homework, longer class periods, additional classroom work

Impact on Extracurricular Activities: Concern over later sports practices, completing chores and homework after practices, practices on the fifth day and transportation

Length of School Day: Ability to focus during longer class times, additional time in school

Non-Traditional Schedule: Four-day school week does not follow the traditional five day a week job.

Source of food for those in need: Concern for those who eat only at school

Changing student work hours: Adjusting work schedule to fit later school day.
